## Pastor's Message

From Pastor Jamie

Back in 2019 Lake Chautauqua Lutheran Center (LCLC) built a new climbing tower and zip line. It had a rock climbing wall, a repelling wall, a cargo net and of course a zip line. It was the source of a lot of excitement. The kids were eager to give it a try and the staff was eager to learn how to lead activities with it and to help the kids experience it. Standing at forty feet tall it was easy to see and easy to get excited for. I was fortunate enough to be one of the people trained to instruct and lead the campers on the equipment. I was eager to get to try it out myself, I knew I'd love climbing up the tower, repelling down and taking the 150 foot journey down the zip line. But what caught me off guard was what ended up being the most memorable part of the experience for me. Getting to the top of the tower and looking out at the camp and the lake. I've spent a lot of time at LCLC and seen just about every breathtaking view the place has to offer, but this was a new view for me looking out from that tower over the trees and down at the lake was just so cool. In many ways the pandemic has been like that tower for me, giving me new views of the Bible

even lessons I've read hundreds of times, and even helping me to see meaning in verses I've paid little attention to.

#### 1st Corinthians 1: 1-5

Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and our brother Sosthene. To the church of God in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus and called to be his holy people, together with all those everywhere who call on the name of our Lord Jesus Christ—their Lord and ours: Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I always thank my God for you because of his grace given you in Christ Jesus.

It seems like a boilerplate letter opening. Sure Paul uses more words but he's essentially just saying dear Corinthians, right? It seemed that way to me, just a Churchy way of opening a letter, reading past it and getting to the information about who God is, what God has done for us and how God would have us respond. The pandemic has helped me to see this verse in a different way. Paul was a traveling evangelist. He would go to an area, spread the gospel, help plant a church, get them running well and then move on. This meant that he spent lots of time with these people but then traveled away leaving them behind. He had to have missed them terribly. They had to have missed him too. In the church we care about one another, are invested in one an-other's lives and we like to gather together often to see each other while we praise God.

Over the past few months I've felt a bit like Paul myself. I started here at St John's back in Midway through 2019 and was the Pastor here for about 9 months until the pandemic hit. 9 Months isn't a long time but it is enough for you and I to get to know one another a bit and to become invested in one another. But since March of last year I've been the pastor in exile, pandemic pastor, parking lot pastor and online pastor. I've missed you. I realized just how much when I was excited for the annual meeting so I could see some people in the building again, and it was great getting to catch up just a bit. I felt the words Paul wrote in his opening to the Corinthians.

I think this pandemic will teach us a lot. But I hope one of the take-aways for the Church is how much community matters to us. How much we need one another as we live into our Gospel calling. I'm sure when we can fully open again the outpouring of enthusiasm will be unparalleled. But until then, Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. I always thank my God for you because of his grace given you in Christ Jesus.
